LGBTQ Report from BCTF Zone Meeting October 16-17, 2015

LGBTQ Policy

Social Justice Representatives are encouraged to ensure that their schools and districts have a LGBTQ policy. I was able to locate policies in our SD 70 Collective Agreement in article E.1 (Non-sexist Environment) and article E.28.1 and 2 (No Discrimination), which also makes reference to the Labour Relations Code and the Human Rights Act of BC.

Gender-Neutral Washrooms

All schools are encouraged to request the need for gender-neutral washrooms in order to create more inclusive and non-discriminatory school atmospheres. By incorporating gender-neutral washrooms into our schools, employees and students alike will not feel obligated to choose a gender identity based on physical biology. The hope is to eliminate the propagation of gender stereotyping based on physical biology by creating a gender-neutral option.

GSAs in All Schools

All schools are encouraged to have some form of Gay-Straight Alliance (GSA) group for students and staff to participate in. A GSA can take on many different forms based on the needs of the students at each school. The aim is to have a non-judgmental, inclusive atmosphere where students can feel safe and secure in who they are and support each other in various ways. It is a place where students can openly ask questions and discuss issues with the support and guidance of teachers and peers.

BCTF Workshops

There are a number of workshops that address LGBTQ topics.
